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1. Listening and Reading course profile

This course focuses on improving reading and listening skills in English. Each class has up to 20 students. The course offers three levels from basic to advanced: [Essentials for Beginners], [Academic Skills for Intermediate Learners], and [Critical Thinking for Advanced Learners]. Starting from the reading and listening of everyday communication in the basic course, the course gradually enriches your vocabulary. In the intermediate level, more academic situations are introduced, and in the advanced level the course presents high-level academic discussions and readings for students to express their thoughts effectively and critically.

- · Lessons are taught by assigned instructors under the guidance of the academic coordinators.
- This course is administered by Waseda University Global Education Center under contract to Waseda University Academic Solutions Corporation.

1.1 Course levels and goals for each level

There are three levels so students can register for courses according to their English proficiency.

Compulsory Students: You will take the course you have been placed in by your department.

%1 Preparation

For [Essentials for Beginners] and [Academic Skills for Intermediate Learners] courses, you can take each preparation task up to two times. The score will be displayed after each attempt, and the higher score will be used for the final grade. Answering the second time is optional. (You can take each preparation task only once for [Critical Thinking for Advanced Learners] course.)

If you are absent from a lesson, you can still submit your answers before the deadline.

※2 Class Quiz / In-class comprehension quiz

You will take the quiz during lessons following the instructor's direction. Please refer to the following for quiz and absence / lateness rules.

- -In case of absence (no entry to the classroom or Collaborate): You will not be eligible for scoring because your identity has not been verified. (The score will be invalid).
- -If you are late, leave early, or leave in the middle for less than 30 minutes: You may take the quiz only for the remaining time.
- -If you are late, leave early, or leave in the middle for more than 30 minutes: You will not be eligible for scoring (the score will be invalid).
- ★For "Academic Skills for Intermediate Learners" courses, you will answer the In-class comprehension quizzes via Waseda Moodle during lessons. Students enrolled in face-to-face class are required to bring a laptop, tablet, smartphone, or other device with Internet access to each lesson. If you do not have a device that you can bring, please consult with the instructor.

%3 Writing Tasks

If your assignment is submitted late, a flat rate of 40% will be deducted from your task score. For example, if your original score is 8 points out of 10, deducting 40% means your actual score will be 4.8 points.

The final deadline for late submissions is <u>23:59 on the last lesson day.</u> (Lesson 14)

You still can submit an assignment even if you are absent.

¾4 Final exam

- The details of the [Essentials for Beginners] final exam will be sent to students via Waseda Mail.
- -In case of absence (no entry to the classroom or Collaborate): You will not be eligible for scoring because your identity has not been verified. (The score will be invalid).
- -If you are late, leave early, or leave in the middle for less than 30 minutes: You may take the quiz only for the remaining time. However, if you are late, you may not be able to answer the listening part, which is conducted first.
- -If you are late, leave early, or leave in the middle for more than 30 minutes: You will not be eligible for scoring (The score will be invalid).
- If you do not show your student ID card or if your identity cannot be verified via camera, the scores may be invalidated.








< How to use the chat function>

Click on the purple icon at the bottom right of the screen and click on icon to display the chat screen.





4.2 Attendances and absences

■The following are the conditions and notes for absences.

- · (On-campus) If you are late or leave early by more than 30 minutes, you will be marked absent.
- (Online) If you are not able to communicate on Collaborate via Waseda Moodle for more than 30 minutes during the lesson, you will be marked absent.

If your instructor does not show up, please wait for 5 minutes and call the Waseda University Academic Solutions Corporation office (03-5286-8030) to let us know. Please wait in the classroom or online classroom for the first 20 minutes of class. You can leave the classroom/online classroom if your instructor still does not show up after waiting for 20 minutes. This means your lesson is cancelled. If you leave without waiting for 20 minutes, you will be marked absent.

- · No prior notification is required for absences.

- The final exam for [Essentials for Beginners] students will be held in Lesson 14. - X Students will be given special consideration for attendance up to 4 times per quarter, and they will be given special consideration for assignments up to once per quarter. Applications exceeding the limit (4 times) are treated as regular absences. If the number of regular absences exceeds 5 times, students will not receive credits for this course.
- * Special consideration for assignments is only applies to the "Class quiz" of [Essentials for Beginners] and "In-class comprehension quiz" for [Academic Skills for Intermediate Learners]. If special consideration is given for assignments, half of the full score will be given for the quiz in question.
- * If the special consideration date is the date of [Essentials for Beginners] final exam, a make-up exam will be held on another date. However, if students take the final exam on the original final exam, they will not be allowed to take the make-up exam. In addition, no make-up exam will be permitted for reasons other than those listed in the table above.
- * "Preparation" for all levels, "Writing Tasks/Assessed Task" for [Academic Skills for Intermediate Learners] and [Critical Thinking for Advanced Learners] are not given special consideration.
- * Regarding hospitalization: Students will only be eligible to apply for special consideration due to

hospitalization if their attendance does not meet the requirements for obtaining credits. Please submit a doctor's certificate. The stamp of your department office is not required.

- Absences due to club activities and match participation cannot be considered.
- ** All the classes of [Essentials for Beginners] and some classes of [Academic Skills for Intermediate Learners] will be delivered Online. The decision of the entire university closure due to weather conditions applies only to the classes held on campus. Classes held online are not eligible because they can be taken from off-campus. Please ensure your own safety and attend online classes if possible. However, you may be able to request consideration for your absence when you decide you can't attend due to weather conditions at the location where you are. If you wish to be considered, please submit an absent report that has been approved by your department to the office stated above.
- * For teaching practice please note that special consideration will not be given if you have registered for a quarterly course (7-week course), so please refrain from taking quarterly courses during the training period.

5. Acts of Misconduct

Definition of violations

1. Violation of rules governing tests and quizzes*1

The acts listed below will be regarded as violations unless the instructor gives special permission allowing them.

- (1) Taking a test on behalf of someone else or having someone else take a test on your behalf.
- (2) Bringing in documents or electrical devices for cheating purposes.
- (3) Using illegal textbooks, notebooks or memos during a test.
- (4) Sharing with others items that have been permitted for use in a test.
- (5) Writing down matters related to a test on parts of the body, clothes, personal belongings or classroom furniture.
- (6) Exchanging answer sheets or looking at another student's answer sheet.
- (7) Copying others or letting other students look at your answer sheet.
- (8) Verbalizing or signaling answers to any test question or using any means of transmission of information to have contact with others.
- (9) Using a false name, handing in an answer sheet with no name, ripping or taking an answer sheet out of the exam room.
- (10) Making changes and continuing to work after the end of a test.
- (11) Not obeying the proctor.
- (12) Engaging in any kind of improper action during a test.
- (13) Raising suspicion of having violated any of these rules.
- (14) Helping others to violate any of these rules.
- 2. Violation of rules governing assignments*2

The acts listed below will be regarded as violations unless the instructor gives special permission allowing them.

- (1) Working on an assignment on behalf of someone else or having someone else work on an assignment on your behalf.
- (2) Copying another student's work and acting as if it was done by you.
- (3) Helping others to copy your work and acting as if it was done by them.

- (4) Using another student's idea, analysis, analysis method, data, research result, essay, terms or knowledge without permission.
- (5) Working on an assignment with others when this is not intended by the instructor.
- 3. Violation of rules governing on-demand tests*3

 The acts listed below will be regarded as violations.
- (1) Taking an on-demand test on behalf of someone else or having someone else take your test on your behalf.
- (2) Taking an on-demand test in collaboration with others.

Grading penalty for violations

A fail will be given for the course on which the violation took place. Furthermore, the violation will be reported to the relevant undergraduate or graduate school office.

Dishonest acts

Any of the following acts are considered to be dishonest conduct.

- (1) When extenuating circumstances are found among any of the above-mentioned acts of misconduct, regarding assignments or online exams.
- (2) Other acts that violate the instructions from the course instructor(s) with regard to grading.
- (3) Any behaviors that prevent an instructor from grading fairly.

Grading penalty for dishonest acts

The grade for the course in which the dishonest act took place will be determined by the class instructor and GEC faculty. However, if the act affects the fairness of grading, those found guilty will receive a penalty equivalent to that of test-taking violators.

- *1 "Tests" are tools to evaluate skills and knowledge using questions or exercises or any tool regarded to be their equivalent. In this case, all students must be informed that the "test" will be the main evaluation method for the course.
- *2 "Assignments" are the results of your research that you hand in as an essay or present in a presentation or demonstration of some sort.
- *3 An "on-demand test" is a test authorized for you to take anywhere using the internet or network system.
