- Test Units (Unit 5 and 10): If you are absent from both Test Units, you will not receive credit.

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

1. Tutorial English course profile

Tutorial English is Waseda University's original language course, which was launched in 2002. The curriculum was significantly revised in April 2021. The course focuses on strengthening speaking skills and has a proven track record in improving English communication skills. The curriculum has the following features.

- Each quarterly course has a total of 10 units, consisting of 2 lessons a week. (Two consecutive periods per day for intensive courses). Each class has a maximum of 4 students and one tutor. Textbooks are developed for Waseda University students, and lessons are conducted in English only.
- Students are placed into lesson groups, Basic to Advanced based on their performance on LANGX Speaking, which is the web-based test for English communication.
- Students will use "Talk", a textbook developed specifically for the course. During Units 5 and 10, the tutor will assess each student based on his/her performance of Can-dos.
- Tutorial Canvas will be used to submit Preparation and confirm the tutors' assessments and feedback.
 - This course will be taught by tutors under the advice of the professor in charge.
 - This course is administered by Waseda University Global Education Center under contract to Waseda University Academic Solutions Corporation.

1.2 Goals for each Level

There are 4 levels designed to match students' English proficiency.

For elective students:

Students select the level of the course. If you can't decide which level you should take, you can check your level at the course consultation during the course registration period. Details will be announced via MyWaseda.

For compulsory students:

Students' levels are determined by their LANGX Speaking score. Students should take the LANGX Speaking test during the designated period. Otherwise, you may not be able to study in the appropriate lesson groups.



Please refer to the point below when registering for courses.

Point

- · Classes A to D at the same level cover class content with the same level of difficulty.
- As for the 3 levels of Basic, Intermediate, and Upper Intermediate, one level is completed in four quarters of A, B, C, and D, so we recommend that you study one level from A to D consecutively.
- · In addition, Advanced is completed in two quarters.

Notice

- · You cannot take more than one level in a guarter.
- You can take another level if you register for a different quarter.
- You cannot take a level that is LOWER than one you previously took.
 For example, you cannot take Basic level after you took Advanced.

Step 1. Course registration

< Elective Students >

Register during the course registration period of your department. To make your learning more effective, we recommend you take two consecutive courses such as A and B (Spring and Summer quarters), C and D (Fall and Winter quarters). You can still take just one if you prefer, though.

Your course level will be the level you register for. If you can't decide which level you should take, you can check your level at the course consultation during the course registration period. (It will take about 10 minutes.) Details will be announced via MyWaseda.

Step 2. Taking the LANGX Speaking test (Pre-course) (20~30 min.)

Students' LANGX Speaking scores will be used for class placement. Students should access the LANGX Speaking site and take the test during the specified period. Students may not be able to study in the appropriate lesson groups if they do not take the test.

Step 3. Paying the course fee

Students who registered for the University-wide Open Courses (Elective) are required to pay the course fee. After the course registration results are announced, the payment information will be sent to your Waseda email address. Please make sure to pay within the designated payment period. If you do not pay, you will not be allowed to take the course.

Step 4. Checking class announcement information

Classroom/lesson booth numbers, tutor names and the course level of compulsory students, which is determined by the LANGX Speaking score result, will be announced on Tutorial Canvas.



Compulsory students will be able to see their course level after the announcement day. (Until then, the course name will be displayed as "Tutorial English (Compulsory)".







3. During the course period

There are 10 lessons, and each lesson is 100 minutes long. Students will have two lessons a week, which are taught by different tutors.

There are some assignments that are graded and occur outside of lesson time, such as Preparation and LANGX Speaking.



Step 1. Preparation

★Graded

Preparation will be assessed (see P.22). Be sure to complete the Preparation on Tutorial Canvas before the lesson. The set period for taking the Preparation quiz is from 7 days before each lesson until the lesson start time. For example, the deadline for the lesson of Unit 1, first period on Monday, April 21, is 8:49 a.m. on Monday, April 21.

%The answer period may be shorter than 7 days on the first day of the quarter (Unit 1).


[Notes]

- It is recommended to read through the textbook and look up any unfamiliar words or expressions so that you can participate in the lesson more effectively.
- You may take the Preparation quiz up to two times; however, the second time is not mandatory. The higher score will be used for the final grade. If you take the Preparation quiz a second time, you will need to answer all the questions, including the ones you have answered correctly.
- The correct answers will be displayed once you have done the quiz two times.
- If you (know you will / plan to) be absent from the lesson, you can still take the Preparation quiz within the set period.
- *Please change the language setting of the browser from Japanese to English if the quiz appears in Japanese.
- *Resubmission due to individual issues including computer problems is not accepted.



■Test Unit English Proficiency Indicators

The Tutorial English textbook, "Talk", is designed in accordance with the CEFR*. In the Test Units of Unit 5 and Unit 10, apart from the assessment, you will be given an indicator of your current English proficiency in Range, Accuracy, Fluency, and Phonology according to the CEFR.



■CEFR English Proficiency Indicators

*The CEFR stands for the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages. In Europe, where multiple languages are used, the CEFR is a common measure of language proficiency in any language. There are scales ranging from A1, for beginners who have just started learning a language, to C2, for those who are highly proficient speakers of a second language. Please refer to the following table for the criteria.

5. Guidelines for LANGX Speaking test

What is LANGX Speaking?

LANGX Speaking is a test designed to measure the ability to initiate spontaneous interaction and maintain it. In this test, a test-taker interacts with a conversational AI agent, which is equipped with spoken dialogue system technologies. The conversational AI agent adaptively changes topics according to the ongoing assessment of the test-taker's proficiency level. By doing this, the conversational AI agent can effectively elicit the upper limit of the test-taker's oral competence.



Fig.: A conversation proceeds on a PC screen.

Features

1 Natural conversation

In the LANGX Speaking test, a test-taker does an interview task and works on a role-play task with a conversational AI agent. The test assesses their oral proficiency through the natural conversation with the AI agent.

2 Adaptive test format

The questions in the interview and role-play tasks are selected based on the incremental assessment of the test-taker's oral proficiency during the test. The entire test takes approximately 20-30 minutes on average, albeit depending on the length of the test-taker's responses.

3 Accurate automated scoring

Using state-of-the-art AI technologies, the LANGX Speaking test quickly calculates one overall score and six analytic scores—Range, Accuracy, Phonology, Fluency, Coherence and Interaction. A score with low confidence may be submitted to be assessed by trained human examiners. In this case, the score release may take longer than usual.

4 Online examination

The LANGX Speaking test is available at any time and any place within the set schedule. However, note that the test can only be taken once and cannot be retaken.

Test period: Refer to P.29

Test format

Warm-up (1 Topic)

You have a short conversation with an Al agent to get yourself ready for speaking in English. Your speech in the warm-up topic is NOT considered for evaluation.

Interview (3 Topics) In the interview task, the test evaluates your ability to continue speech spontaneously. You respond to multiple interview questions from the conversation Al agent.

Role-play

You exchange opinions with the Al agent, ask questions and make suggestions to the agent. In this task, your ability to maintain an interaction collaboratively is assessed.

6. Overall points and final grade calculation

6.1 Areas for assessment

Lessons will be graded based on the number of lessons attended and the total number of points earned in the following areas of evaluation, in accordance with the evaluation guidelines (see pages 25 and 26). Since each unit has its own learning objectives, attendance and active participation in the lesson is a must for grading. Therefore, the number of times you attend will affect your grade.

The dates for issuing grades for Global Education Center courses, including Tutorial English, are set by each department according to the period of the courses. Students should confirm with their department office about when and how they can receive their grades.

6.2 Attendance and absences

Tutorial English is a course that evaluates the achievement of Can-do goals, so attendance is important.

<u>In principle, any absence for any reason will be treated as an "absence"</u> and no substitute lessons will be given.

Transportation delay certificates are <u>not</u> accepted.

The following are the conditions and notes for attendance and absence.

■ Attendance

- You must be able to communicate for at least 45 minutes during the class period to be eligible for attendance.
- Assessment points will not be deducted for "arriving late/leaving early" within 45 minutes. However, if you are not able to take part in the Interaction or Can-do assessments due to the lateness or leaving early, the number of assessment points you receive will be reduced.

■ Absence

- If you are unable to communicate for more than 45 minutes during the class period, you will be considered absent.
- If you are late or leave early by more than 45 minutes, you will be considered absent, but you will still be able to receive the Preparation, Interaction, and Can-do points according to your participation.
- · You are encouraged to take the online Preparation Quiz even if you will be absent from a lesson/unit.
- · No prior notification is required for absences.

■ Others

- When the number of absences reaches 4, the student will not be able to receive credit. Lessons attended and absences can be checked on Tutorial Canvas.
- · You will not receive credit if you miss two Test Units, even if your absences are fewer than 4 times.

6.3 Cancellation of lessons and make-up lessons

In principle, lessons will not be canceled. However, if the entire university is closed and the lesson is canceled, please follow the policy set by the university. You will be informed via MyWaseda when a make-up lesson is offered.

LESSON ASSESSMENT GUIDELINES (レッスン評価ガイドライン)

PREPARATION

To receive points, students should complete the unit Preparation online before each lesson. The majority of Preparation activities involve some form of listening comprehension, answering unit-related questions, or listing ideas for the unit. Completion of the online Preparation will help students build familiarity with the unit content and help them prepare to discuss this content in detail.

Preparation is scored between 0-12 points on 12 multiple choice questions, each worth 1 point.

E.g. 12 points: when all answers are correct.

5 points: when 5 answers are correct.

0 points: when the Preparation has not been completed, or when all answers are incorrect

Open-ended questions are not scored. However, answering these questions will allow students to consider the topic in advance, making the in-class conversations smoother and possibly improving students' in-class performance. Students should be prepared to share their ideas and responses to these questions in class.

INTERACTION

Interaction is based on the student's initiative and participation in all lesson activities. It is determined by the students' willingness to participate in all aspects of the lesson through turn-taking, active listening, and working with others. The criteria depend on the level. Each aspect of Interaction is scored as 0, 3, or 6 points.


